3rd Lithuanian Kyudo Championships:

Follows the rules of the IKYF/ANKF.

Categories – individual competition (Kojin), together male and female group.

Format – Kinteki (distance 28 m), Kasumi Mato (target 36 cm), Zasha (kneeling form), Yotsuya (4 arrows).

Timing – Shinsa Maai (examination).

Number of arrows – 12 (3 ends of 4 arrows).

First three places – decision by hits – will receive Medals and Diplomas.

Champion – highest ranked by hits Lithuanian – will receive Cup and Diploma.

A Style prize for Lithuanian participants – for the best overall performance – will receive special Prize and Diploma.

In case of a tie:

1st place or Champion will be decided by Izume (hit/miss) shoot off system.

2nd and 3rd places will be decided by Enkin (closest to the centre) shoot off system.
