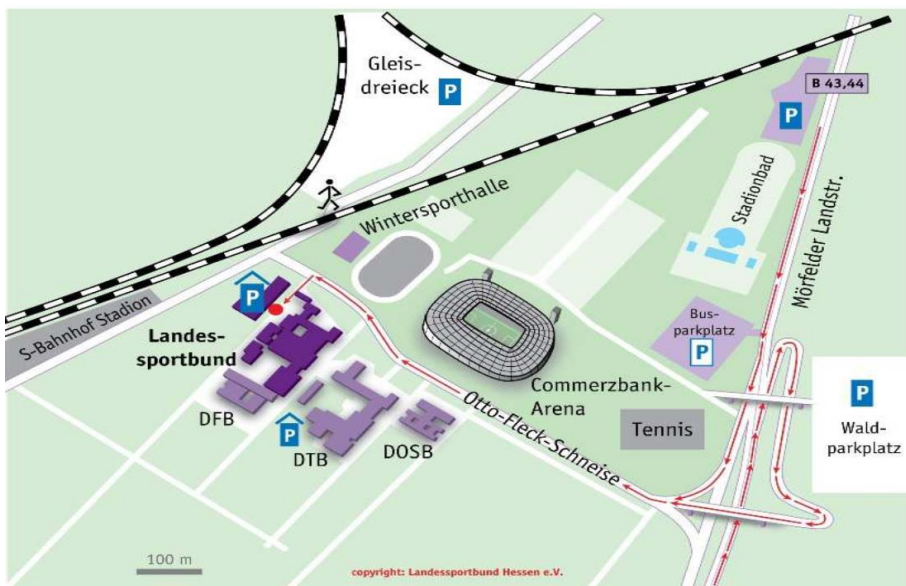

From the Motorway Köln-Würzburg (A 3):

Please take the motorway exit Frankfurt-Süd and drive towards Stadion "Commerzbank-Arena" and follow the signs "Sportverbände" on the right which brings you onto Otto-Fleck-Schneise. Please drive further along the Otto-Fleck-Schneise leaving the Commerzbank-Arena Stadium on the right and take the last street on the left way to Landessportbund Hessen e.V.

From the Airport by car:

Please take "B 43 Frankfurt Innenstadt" towards the centre of the city and follow the signs "Sportverbände" on the right which brings you onto Otto-Fleck-Schneise. Please drive further along the Otto-Fleck-Schneise leaving the Commerzbank-Arena Stadium on the right and take the last street on the left way to Landessportbund Hessen e.V.

From the centre of the city by car:

Please follow the signs "Flughafen/Stadion" via Kennedy-Allee and Mörfelder Landstraße and pass the exit Stadion "Commerzbank-Arena" leaving on the right and take the next exit on the right which brings you onto Otto-Fleck-Schneise. Please drive further along the Otto-Fleck-Schneise leaving the Commerzbank-Arena Stadium on the right and take the last street on the left way to Landessportbund Hessen e.V.

From the centre of the city by public transport:

At Hauptbahnhof, Hauptwache, Konstablerwache etc. stations take the S-Bahn (Subway) S 8 or S 9 (direction Frankfurt Flughafen) till S-Bahnhof "Stadion" and walk towards "Stadion" and then into the first street to the right where you will see the sign of Landessportbund Hessen e.V. at the entrance of the street. (walk approx. 10 minutes)

From the airport ("Flughafen") by public transport:

At the airport please take the S-Bahn (Subway) S 8 or S 9 (direction Frankfurt Hauptbahnhof) till S-Bahnhof "Stadion" and walk towards "Stadion" and then into the first street to the right where you will see the sign of Landessportbund Hessen e.V. at the entrance of the street. (walk approx. 10 minutes)

Closing date for applications and payments

All application forms must be received no later than February **the 1st, 2017**.

A deposit of € 100,- is required, this payment must be received no later than April **1st, 2017**.

Closing date for the second payment is May **1st, 2017** at latest.

Participation requirements and Taikai guidelines

A maximum of 2 teams of 3 archers per country (1 reserve per team; optional).

Double entry for the team and individual competition.

Those countries that cannot send a team may send individual archers. Those archers will start grouped by three (like a team) on Saturday together with the regular teams. They have to qualify themselves for the individual taikai like the archers within the team competition.

The minimum age is 16 years old, with no upper age limit.

The event is open to both men and women.

The overall rules governing this tournament are the ANKF Rules of Competition (June 1991) with the guidelines based on these rules:

Both competitions will be held in kneeling form - zassha; if the time allows. Otherwise, standing form – rissha will be used.

Participants unable to perform zassha must submit a request to perform rissha supported by a medical certificate.

Scoring for both competitions will use the accuracy system (tekichusei) - decision based on the number of hits.

Order of shooting will use kyogi maai (competition timing) for the team taikai and shinza maai for the individual taikai.

Both national team and individual competition shall follow the tournament method with tie breaks following the izume method.

Finalists for the individual's competition will be selected from the 20 highest individual scores in the team event.

Minimum rounds for the team competition will be 2 x 4 (yotsuya) plus the tie break.

Minimum rounds for the individual competition will be 2 x 2 (hitote) plus the tie break.

Awards

Both team and individual's competitions will have 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places awarded.

1st, 2nd and 3rd places will receive an award certificate, and the 1st place holders will hold the team and individuals trophy until the next EKF Taikai. Their achievement will be recorded on a ribbon to be attached to the trophy.

A "style prize" will be awarded by the shajo judges to the most promising archer in the event. Selection of the "style prize" winner will be based on overall performance. The winner will also receive an award certificate.

Equipment and clothing

Equipment must follow the accepted requirement (§ 23) ANKF Rules of Competition.

Clothing must follow the accepted requirement (§ 24) ANKF Rules of Competition.
